

CES Guild – Awards Committee Guidelines

Show and Tell Guidelines

- Show and Tell events are usually held at the end of the CES Guild meetings except for specified months such as the Sew-A-Thon and the Holiday Party. See your newsletter each month to verify Show and Tell events.
- All members and their guests may present quilted or sewing items of interest to the guild at a Show and Tell event.
- If you have other items of interest, please ask the Awards Committee if there will be time to share those items.
- Please show only 2-3 items per Show and Tell event.
- If you have more than 2-3 items, please bring the additional items to the next event.

Awards Committee Guidelines

The beads are awarded by the Awards Committee and are based on the information from Show and Tell. Beads are awarded only to CES Members.

- Charity Bead Awards:
 - Charity beads are given for “finished quilted items” only that are presented at Show and Tell as charity items or are shown to the Awards Committee prior to being given to the charity.
 - You do not have to “show” charity items at Show and Tell. You may show them to the Awards Committee ahead of time before the CES guild meeting and then give them direct to the Community Service Committee.
- Other Bead Awards:
 - Beads are given for “finished quilted items only” that are presented at Show and Tell. If you have a photograph of the quilt or do not want to show the quilt, show them to the Awards Committee at a guild meeting to be awarded your beads.
 - Beads are only awarded for quilts that are made by the CES member themselves or a group of CES members.
 - If the quilt is “quilted by hire”, only the CES member presenting the quilt will be awarded.
 - The CES member must sign up their quilts, print name, type of quilt and quantity, on the “Show and Tell” sign up sheet prior to the guild meeting.

Any inconsistencies or “judgment calls” are decided by the Awards Committee.

Holiday Money and Additional Awards Guidelines

The Holiday Money awards are maintained by several committees depending on the type of award.

- Charity Holiday Money:
 - Each finished quilt presented through Show and Tell for a current CES sanctioned charity will be tallied for Holiday Money. No other “charity quilts” will be awarded holiday money.

- Each finished pillowcase for ConKerr Cancer shown to the Awards Committee and tallied will be awarded holiday money.
- Each member present and working at the Sew-A-Thon will be awarded holiday money.
- Special Charity Quilt Awards:
 - Each finished quilt presented through Show and Tell for a current CES sanctioned charity will be tallied for the “special charity quilt awards”. No other “charity quilts” will be counted towards this award.
 - The minimum number of charity quilts is twelve (12) presented from January through November of the calendar year. December is not available for counting towards the award.
- Special Pillowcase Awards:
 - Each finished pillowcase presented to the Awards Committee for ConKerr Cancer will be tallied for the “special pillowcase award”. No other “pillowcases” will be counted towards this award.
 - The minimum number of pillowcases is twenty-five (25) presented from January through November of the calendar year. December is not available for counting towards the award.
- UFO/NESTY Awards:
 - Each finished quilt presented through Show and Tell for the member’s current UFO/NESTY sign up sheet is maintained by the UFO/NESTY committee.
 - The UFO/NESTY committee designate which members have fulfilled the contest and will present the awards at the end of the contest period.
- CES Donation Quilt Ticket Sales:
 - The Ways and Means committee, at their discretion, may set up an amount of Holiday Money for members selling tickets for the CES Donation Quilt.
 - The Ways and Means committee designates which members have fulfilled the requirements for selling tickets and obtaining Holiday Money.
 - They give the list of “awardees” to the Awards Committee after the November CES Guild meeting so that the Holiday Money will be awarded at the Holiday Party.
- Holiday Money at the Holiday Party Event:
 - Prior to the Holiday Party Event, a list of “how to make Holiday Money” will be presented to the CES Guild by email, by handout at the November meeting, or both.
 - “Making money” may include special dress items, bringing your assigned food contribution, donating orphan blocks, and may other items again to be announced.
 - Remember, the CES Guild sometimes has a “challenge” quilt contest during the year. You will be awarded “Holiday Money” if you complete the challenge and extra money if you win.
